

Jordan Chatman

Born in Chicago, Jordan attended Tuskegee University and graduated with a degree in Political Science. While attending Tuskegee University, Jordan participated in the Historically Black Colleges and Universities Initiative (HBCUI) created by Greening Youth Foundation. Following that, Jordan went to Washington D.C. where he became an AmeriCorps member and supported the director of the OSMRE-AmeriCorps program; he interned in the Office of the Secretary of the Interior and developed a social media strategy for President Obama's Every Kid in a Park Initiative; and he was the Government Relations Assistant for The Corps Network where he advocated for policies that would create more opportunities for Corps and Corpsmembers.

After Washington, DC, Jordan returned to Alabama to work at the Tuskegee Institute National Historic Site and subsequently, was selected, from over 7,500 applicants, to participate in Patagonia's internship program in Ventura, CA. During his time there, he supported Patagonia's Director of Global Communications, recorded over 30 voiceovers and product videos, participated in Patagonia's first-ever Wetsuit Repair Tour and curated Patagonia's first-ever Southeast College Tour, which featured seven Historically Black Colleges and Universities. Most recently, Jordan transitioned into event production where he helped produce global corporate, non-profit and political events such as Apple's Worldwide Developers Conference (WWDC) in Cupertino, CA, climate events at the 2019 United Nations Climate Change Conference in Madrid, Spain, outdoor car rallies for Jon Ossoff's 2020 US Senate runoff in Georgia, and The 59th Presidential Inauguration in Washington, DC.

He continues to freelance as an event producer and currently supports Patagonia's Public Relations and Communications team.
