### What are Corps?







Based on model of Civilian Conservation Corps of the New Deal Era (1930s – 1940s)



Comprehensive service and workforce development programs (some Corps also offer GED / high school diploma program)



Operated by nonprofits or units of state and local government



Participants – "Corpsmembers" – include young adults age 16 – 30, veterans up to age 35



Service projects address environmental, community and disaster response needs

### Each Corps is a little different, but they all share common elements

Corpsmember transitional support and follow-up services

Engage Corpsmembers in crews or Individual Placements

Corpsmembers work under supervision of trained Crew Leaders and mentors

Intensive Corpsmember and Crew Leader orientations and trainings

Paid service-learning and work experience

### The Corps Model





#### **Contracting with Youth Conservation Corps**

- Matching funds
  - Capability to leverage additional revenue sources
- Budget customizations per project/partner,
  - scope of work analyses, annual audit review and report completions; and cost efficient programming
- In-house recruitment, project site visit teams, orientation and training for Corpsmembers
- Executive, program, and administrative oversight & support
- Tools, equipment, materials & supplies, uniforms, etc.
- General Liability, Workers Compensation Insurance
- Skilled, professional Supervisors

### What Can Corps Do?



#### Just a few examples...

#### **Enhance neighborhoods & community public spaces**

- Build & maintain parks, playgrounds
- Landscaping, tree care
- Reclaim abandoned lots, brownfield remediation
- Build & maintain trails
- Build & maintain urban farms, gardens
- Trash and recyclable collection
- Graffiti abatement
- Provide educational programming on conservation-related topics for youth, community members
- Constructing, improving park shelters, benches, signage

#### **Protect/restore habitats**

- Invasive species removal/reintroduction of native species
- Water quality and species monitoring
- Fencing installation
- Construction of nesting boxes,
- Wetland & coastal restoration

#### Disaster preparedness/response

- Erosion and flood control measures
- Installing/maintaining storm water management infrastructure
- Volunteer management
- Wildfire mitigation and response
- Debris removal, mucking/gutting

#### Help conserve resources

- Weatherizing/retrofitting homes and public structures
- Conducting energy audits
- Installing insulation, sealing air flow, replacing windows
- Installing solar panels

#### **Preserve historic structures**

- Foundation stabilization
- Masonry
- Carpentry
- Tuckpointing




#### **Corpsmember Demographics in 2018**

















#### **Corpsmember Demographics in 2016 - 2018**





#### **Corpsmember Certifications: 2016 - 2018**










